

AN INTERIM EMERGENCY ZONING ORDINANCE

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Mariposa, State of California, do hereby ordain:

SECTION I: FINDINGS AND DECLARATION OF INTENT:

The Midpines Area Planning Advisory Committee, in conjunction with the Planning Commission, is presently conducting a comprehensive evaluation of the minimum parcel size for the Midpines area. From a health and welfare standpoint, there exists a potential degredation of surface and sub-surface water conditions which must be resolved before allowing development to take place on small parcels. The Board of Supervisors, in response to requests from the Midpines Area Study Committee and the Planning Commission, enacted Interim Emergency Zoning Ordinance No. 500; This ordinance placed a five acre minimum on all subdivisions in the Study Area. Ordinance 500 was adopted February 27, 1979 and allowed to lapse prior to adoption of specific development regulations being adopted or the appropriate hearings being held for extension under provisions of Government Code 65858.

The Midpines Study Committee and the Mariposa County Planning Commission recommended that the Ordinance be extended. The Committee further recommended that the entire Study Area be reclassified as 5 acre minimum lot sizes and the Planning Commission is acting affirmatively on this recommendation. In order to avoid the frustration of any comprehensive land use plan for the area, and for the purpose of protecting the public health, safety and welfare, the Board of Supervisors finds that it is necessary to adopt the regulations set forth in this ordinance.

SECTION II: LOT SIZE:

In the area detailed in Exhibit "A:, attached hereto and made a

1 part hereof, and referred to as the "Midpines Study Area", that minimum lot size 2 for parcels shall be five (5) acres. 3 SECTION III: URGENCY ORDINANCE: This ordinance is an urgency ordinance to protect the public health, 4 5 safety and welfare. The facts constituting the urgency are that the herein described area is presently under study for reclassification because of health 6 7 and safety problems arising from high density development. 8 This ordinance takes effect immediately and, in accordance with Government Code Section 65858, is in no further force and effect one hundred 9 twenty (120) days from the date of its adoption, except as it may be extended 10 as provided by Section 65858 of the Government Code. 11 SECTION IV: PENALTY 12 Violation of any provision of this ordinance shall constitute a 13 misdemeanor and shall be punishable under the General Penalty provisions of 14 the Mariposa County Code. 15 PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Board of Supervisors, County of Mariposa, 16 this 24th Day of July, 1979 by the following vote: 17 AYES: Clark, Owings, Dalton, Weber, Erickson 18 NOES: None 19 NOT VOTING: None 20 ABSENT: None 21 22 TON, JR., CHAIRMÂN BOARD OF SUPERVISORS 23 ATTEST: 24 25
