The Board of Supervisors of the County of Mariposa do hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: TIMBERLAND PRESERVE ZONE

Mariposa County Ordinance No. 180 is hereby amended by adding the following Subsection D to Section IV to establish a "TPZ" Timberland Preserve Zone for certain land under the jurisdiction of Mariposa County.

SECTION 2: PURPOSE

The "TPZ" Timberland Preserve Zone is intended to be an exclusive zone for the growing and harvesting of timber and for those uses which are an integral part of a timber management operation.

A TPZ will replace the use of Williamson Act Contracts on timberland to provide a tax structure conducive to timber management operations. Land use under a TPZ will be restricted for a minimum of ten (10) years to growing and harvesting timber, and to compatible uses approved by the County.

All requirements and restrictions of the Z'berg-Warren-Collier Forest Taxation Reform Act of 1976 shall apply.

SECTION 3: USES PERMITTED

The following uses are permitted in the "TPZ" without special permit.:

A. Growing and harvesting of timber and forest products.

The deadline imposed by state law for adopting an ordinance of this nature is March 1, 1977, and in order to meet said time limit, it is necessary that this be deemed an emergency measure.
