RESOLUTION - ACTION REQUESTED 2019-614

RE: 2019-2022 Justice Assistance Grant Program

RECOMMENDATION AND JUSTIFICATION:

Adopt a resolution to participate in the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Federal Grant Program, also known as the Drug Enforcement Team, effective October 1, 2019 through December 31, 2022; and authorize the Chief Probation Officer to sign the grant application and agreement, including any amendments, modifications or extensions thereof, with the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) for annual funding based on Federal allocations to the State of California (Subject to approval as to form by County Counsel.).

Mariposa County Probation Department re-submitted an application to BSCC on April 25, 2019 to continue JAG funding for the existing Drug Enforcement Team program. This funding supports the salaries and benefits of four county positions assigned to grant activities. On September 12, 2019, BSCC approved the grant application submitted by the Probation Department.

A budget action increasing revenue and appropriations will be brought back to the Board for approval. Disbursement of grant funds will occur on a reimbursement basis for costs incurred during each quarterly reporting period over the next three years.

The grant application has been approved for funding by BSCC in an amount not to exceed 607,134.00 for the term of the agreement beginning October 1, 2019 and ending December 31, 2022. Program funding is contingent on Federal allocations to the State in years two and three.

BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF BOARD ACTIONS:

The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program was created as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2005. Mariposa County has been receiving these funds annually to support the Drug Enforcement Team, formerly known as the Drug Task Force. The Board of Supervisors has consistently authorized the Chief Probation Officer to sign the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Federal Grant applications, agreements and other grant related documents.

ALTERNATIVES AND CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this request is not granted, the County will not be able to accept the grant award from the Board of State and Community Corrections and the Drug Enforcement Team program will not be funded.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

A budget action increasing revenue and appropriations will be brought back to the Board for approval. The Justice Assistance Grant is fully funded with State and Federal Grant Funds.

ADOPT A RESOLUTION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE
FEDERAL GRANT PROGRAM (JAG), ALSO KNOWN AS,
THE DRUG ENFORCEMENT TEAM
EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2019 TO DECEMBER 31, 2022

WHEREAS, the Mariposa County Board of Supervisors desires to participate in the Drug Enforcement Team Program supported by the Federal Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program and administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (hereafter referred to as the BSCC), for the grant period dated October 1, 2019 to December 31, 2022; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Chief Probation Officer is authorized on behalf of this Governing Board to accept the JAG funding awarded by BSCC, in an amount, not to exceed \$607,134.00 during the three-year grant period and sign the grant application and agreement with the BSCC to accept funding, including any amendments, modifications or extensions thereof, subject to approval as to form by County Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that federal grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mariposa County Probation Department, as the implementing agency and the Mariposa County Sheriff's Department and Mariposa County District Attorney's Office, as the partnering entities, agree to abide by the statutes and regulations governing the Federal Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program, as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the BSCC.
