RE: Approval for submission of the Family Centered Substance Abuse Treatment Grants for Adolescents and their Families (CFDA # 93.243)

Recommendation

It is respectfully recommended that the Board of Supervisors:
Approve submission of the Family Centered Substance Abuse Treatment Grants for Adolescents and their Families (CFDA # 93.243) in the amount of \$572,788 to the Department of Health and Human Services – Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

Background

The purpose of this funding is to provide alcohol and drug treatment to adolescents and their families throughout Mariposa County, utilizing the evidence-based *Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach* and *Assertive Continuing Care* models. This Project, which will be known as the **Adolescent and Family Treatment Project** will target adolescents, ages 12-17, who have been assessed to have a substance abuse problem. At the outset of the Project, services will be provided in two major geographic areas of the County, Mariposa and Coulterville, to decrease access barriers due to transportation. As the need changes, additional service locations may be added. The *Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach (A-CRA)* to alcohol and substance use treatment is a behavioral intervention that seeks to increase the family, social, and educational/vocational supports of an adolescent to support recovery. It utilizes a combination of individual counseling with the adolescent, individual counseling with parents/caretakers; family counseling with the adolescent and their parents/caretakers; and skills building training for both the adolescent and their parent/caretaker. The *Assertive Continuing Care (ACC)* model, includes home visits and case management for youth following treatment for substance abuse or dependence in order to prevent or reduce the likelihood of relapse. The goals of the Project are to: 1) reduce substance use amongst Project participants; 2) increase participant skills to support ongoing recovery (such as problem-solving, communication, peer relationship, etc.); 3) increase positive social activities to support recovery; and 4) increase parent/caretaker motivation and skills to support youth recovery (such as communication, relationship, and parenting). Mariposa County Behavioral Health and Recovery Services is currently requesting funds to provide outreach, assessment, treatment and ongoing recovery support in the average amount of \$190,000 per year for three years (\$572,788). It is anticipated that after a period of staff training and outreach to the community, a total of

62 adolescents and their families will be served during the three-year Project.

Financial

If approved, this grant will bring \$572,788 in Federal revenue into Mariposa County. No cash match is required. There will be no impact to the County General Fund.
