Mariposa County Behavioral Health and Recovery Services has implemented a project proposal process to obtain a provider for the Mariposa County Driving Under the Influence Program (DUI). Background:

Beginning in 1978, the California State Legislature enacted a statewide system of classes for DUI offenders. The AB541 class is now mandatory for all persons over 21 who (1) get convicted in court of a first offense DUI charge, and/or (2) whose licenses get suspended by the California DMV for driving with a BAC of 0.08%, considered over the allowed legal limit.

Overview:

Mariposa County Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (MCBHRS) is seeking proposals for the provision of Driving Under the Influence/Impaired Drivers, (DUI) services. All DUI programs are self-supporting through client fees. The fees must cover the cost of facilities, salaries, services, equipment and all operations. A percentage of the enrollment fee is paid to the State of California and MCBHRS on a quarterly bases, through quarterly reporting.

A California court may order a driver to participate in an alcohol and drug problem assessment program after being convicted of a first offense Driving Under the Influence (DUI). A driver convicted of a DUI with one or more prior convictions in the last ten years must participate in said assessment. Programs exist on a county by county basis. The Mariposa County under the Influence (DUI) Programs includes: Wet and Reckless, 3 Month First Offender Program, 6 Month First Offender Program, 9 Month First Offender Program, 12 Month Multiple Offender Program and 18 Month Multiple Offender Program.

The Mariposa County under the Influence (DUI) Programs can assist individuals in completing court-ordered and DMV (Department of Motor Vehicles) requirements. The objective of the DUI program is to reduce the number of repeat DUI offenses by persons who complete state-licensed DUI programs. The DUI Programs will:

- Provide services as outline in Title IX (attached)
- Be licensed/certified by the Department of Health Care Services to provide these services.
- Provide participants an opportunity to address problems related to the use of alcohol and/or other drugs;
- Provide education, group counseling and face-to-face interviews to enable participants to consider attitudes and behavior related to reducing or eliminating the use of alcohol and/or drugs;
- Provide referrals for ancillary services when needed to support a positive lifestyle, including service through the Substance Use Disorder program at MCBHRS.
